News From the Hill: February 15, 2019


Just ahead of the February 15th deadline to enact an agreement to finalize the seven outstanding Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 appropriations bills or risk another government shutdown, the president signed an agreement hammered out by Democratic and Republican leaders in Congress. There was a great deal of uncertainty until the very end with the White House visibly upset by a congressional agreement that ultimately included fewer resources for border security than the previously rejected proposal, which caused the month-long partial government shutdown.



While nearly every part of the public health services has been continuously operating due to the fact the FY 2019 Labor-Health and Human Services-Education Appropriations bill was one of the five spending bills enacted last fall, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is part of the Agriculture spending bill and was caught up in the partial government shutdown.
